




Curriculum

This term, alongside our Literacy topics, we will be establishing rules and fairness, listening to and following instructions and discussing how and why things are done. We will also enjoy and explore a range of creative learning opportunities. The books the children will explore are;

Spring 1:



Owl Babies- The children will be settling into their new environment. The book will support their sitting and listening skills whilst responding to questions with regards to their feelings and emotions. Environmental sounds will be explored and further developed. The children will be given the opportunities to use props and pictures to support this.

Little monkey- The children will be encouraged to notice things in their new school environment. The children will have the opportunity to explore their environment through their play interests. The children will further develop a sense of security within their environment and develop friendships in order to scaffold learning through play.



If Big can I can- The children will show that they understand some action words, through pointing at the corresponding picture or answering questions such as who is climbing, swinging, jumping? The children will look at the sequence of the story and answer what, when and where questions. The children will use physical activities to strengthen their core muscles to support their development across all areas.




Spring 2:

In the second half of term the children will demonstrate a sense of belonging. They will be given opportunities to grow their talents and interests. Children will be challenged in their learning and development and further develop their vocabulary and use of connective words in order to structure sentences.



Almost Anything The children will be encouraged to retell the story and discuss their own talents and interests. They will use busy learning opportunities to grow their talents and interests and be introduced and encouraged to engage in more challenging tasks. The children will be given opportunities to focus their attention on self-chosen tasks and adult led activities.

You Matter- Children will talk about the importance of being kind to one another and explore our similarities and differences. Children will be able to link words to create a short sentence to discuss their family and who is important to them and who they are important to. Children will begin to talk about how they are feeling, using words as well as actions.





The wonderful things you will be Children will recap their sitting and listening skills and begin to use rhyming words to further develop their vocabulary, which will enhance play opportunities. Children will Begin to understand the need to respect and care for their natural environment and all living things. children will continue to develop positive attitudes about the differences between people.

Mathematics: Children will be focusing on numbers (up to 5). They will learn how to represent numbers using their fingers, marks and concrete objects. They will count up to 5 objects saying a number name for each item. They will gain some understanding of how quantities change when an item is added or taken away. Children will notice simple shapes and patterns in the environment and use appropriate shapes during play and specific tasks.

This year we are continuing our RE scheme, *Come and See* to deepen children's understanding of faith, please see details of units below:

<u>Celebrating:</u> In this unit we will be exploring how people in Church.

<u>Gathering:</u> In this unit children will explore the parish family gathers to celebrate the Eucharist.

Growing: In this unit we look how to prepare for Easter.
