

Ultimately, however, the number and speed with which he scoffs the books, leads to indigestion and Henry needs to change his culinary habits.



An Alphabet of Stories


A brilliant, humorously executed, concept based around the idea that each letter must have a story because 'If words make up stories, and letters make up words, then stories are

Reception have had another wonderful week! The children have been creating their own storyboards following the story 'The Rainbow Fish'. They have included the characters, setting and the plot.

In Maths, the children have been exploring 3D shapes through playing 'shape shop' and going on a 3D shape hunt!


The children also visited the Church and had the opportunity to ask Canon Michael questions in relation to their 'Religious Celebrations' topic in RE.











We have had another great week in Year 1. We have been writing character descriptions, adding numbers within 20 and thinking about why Jesus is a special person. We also learnt about real life heroes in our PSHE lessons and how they help us.

Our highlight for this week was attending the KS1 Phase Liturgy in which we sang hymns and had time to reflect with God.

Children were lucky enough to visit Deacon Con at St Teresa's Church on Tuesday, to find out more about the different special books that are used during Mass.

In **English lessons** we have been working hard to improve writing by creating a **setting description of a storm** in the middle of the sea.

In Maths we have been learning about money, money, money and getting used to counting in both pounds and pence.

And during **Geography** this week we have been **learning more about** the wonderful country that is **China**.

This week our wonderful NED champions are: Milita in 2LM and Mathias in 2CM. Well done to you both!



Another fun week was had! We started a new topic in maths about measurements. We used a ruler to measure in millimetres and centimetres. In RE, we went on our own pilgrimage around the school singing psalms and exploring why it was important in Jesus' time. Newspaper article writing was the focus in English this week- we wrote about the discovery of Tut's tomb. We have also been exploring the importance of the River Nile on life in Ancient Egypt in History.

Year 4 deepened their knowledge and skills in Science this week based on their continuing topic on 'States of Matter.' We created an investigation, thinking about variables, to find out the melting point of chocolate. We used varying temperatures of water to see how long it would take for the chocolate to melt.


We are also reading on in 'Odd and the Frost Giants' and thinking about adventurous and descriptive language to describe 'Asgaard' within the story and linking this to learning and using grammar terms like prepositional phrases. In Maths, we are coming to the end of our topic on 'Length and perimeter' which the children have enjoyed.

In 4D, Erick is our NED champion this week for his exemplary behaviour for learning! He does his best in everything he does and has consistently impressed me with his approach to any lesson. He is a shining example to others and should be so proud of himself!

The children have been starting to consider how they will write a poem inspired by The Malfeasance. During RE, we discussed Christian unity and how we can follow our mission to unite everyone.


