### When It Rains by Rassi Narika



### Reception


<sup>3/11</sup> Ahoy there, me hearties, Reception have been sailing the seven seas this week to start our new half term.




Year 3 have had a great start after the half term break. It was wonderful to join the rest of school to celebrate All Saints' Day on Wednesday.

This week we continued our topic in art on drawing with a lesson on tone and shading. We used charcoal and other charcoal-based medi to replicate images of lace in our art books.

In PSHE, we began learning about Zones of Regulation which will help us to focus our attention, control our emotions and manage our thinking, behaviour and feelings.





In Year 5, we have had an extremely exciting week exploring the origins of the ancient Kingdom of Benin, a civilisation that lasted almost a thousand years in a part of West Africa that is now Nigeria! The children have been fascinated by our new History topic and should be able to tell you lots of interesting facts!

In English, we have also began reading *Children of the Benin Kingdom* by Dinah Orji, a brilliant adventure story about a child called Ada who lived in that ancient civilisation.

We have also started our fractions topic in Maths after wrapping up multiplication and division. The children have been working really hard at remembering our new vocabulary, with concepts such as multiples, factors, prime numbers, square numbers and cube numbers. Well done, everyone!




