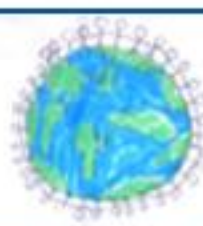

Curriculum

This term, alongside new challenges, the children will be consolidating all of their learning so far in preparation for year 1.

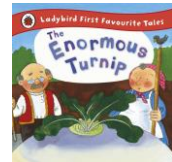
In **summer term 1** the books the children will explore are;

Errol's Garden- We will be revisiting this book, but this time linking it with our Summer 1 topic of growing. This will be the children's introduction to Science as a subject.

Oliver's Vegetables - The children will look at time and days of the week. They will explore healthy eating and trying new things. In literacy they will be writing a diary page.

The Enormous Turnip - During this book the children will have the opportunity to retell this classic tale, using their own characters, settings and plots.

The Tiny Seed - The children will look at instructions on how to grow a seed using time connectives. They will also explore letter writing.



In **summer term 2** the children are introduced to a variety of non-fiction books linked to our theme of 'People who help us in our community'

Alongside this, the children will think about and discuss people who help us and talk about the features of their own immediate environment and how they might vary from one another.

Mathematics: The children will be focusing and building on numbers beyond 10, exploring and deepening their understanding of counting patterns within this (doubling, sharing, grouping, odd and even). Within spatial reasoning the children will investigate maps.

At home, children may have access to the web from many different devices, not just PC's and laptops. They often have tablets (e.g. iPads), mobile phones, X Boxes, PlayStation, Nintendo DS, e-Readers and other Wi-Fi-enabled devices. It's important to be aware of this and the best way to ensure their safety is to ensure that your child is supervised whilst having such access. With many of these devices they are able to access inappropriate sites & games, and may also be able to communicate with strangers online. Some devices do have the ability to impose parental controls. At the start of every academic year each child receives Digital Citizenship lessons that teach them how to be safe online at an age appropriate level.
