ALTITUDE

Altitude is used to describe heights in geography, astronomy and maths.

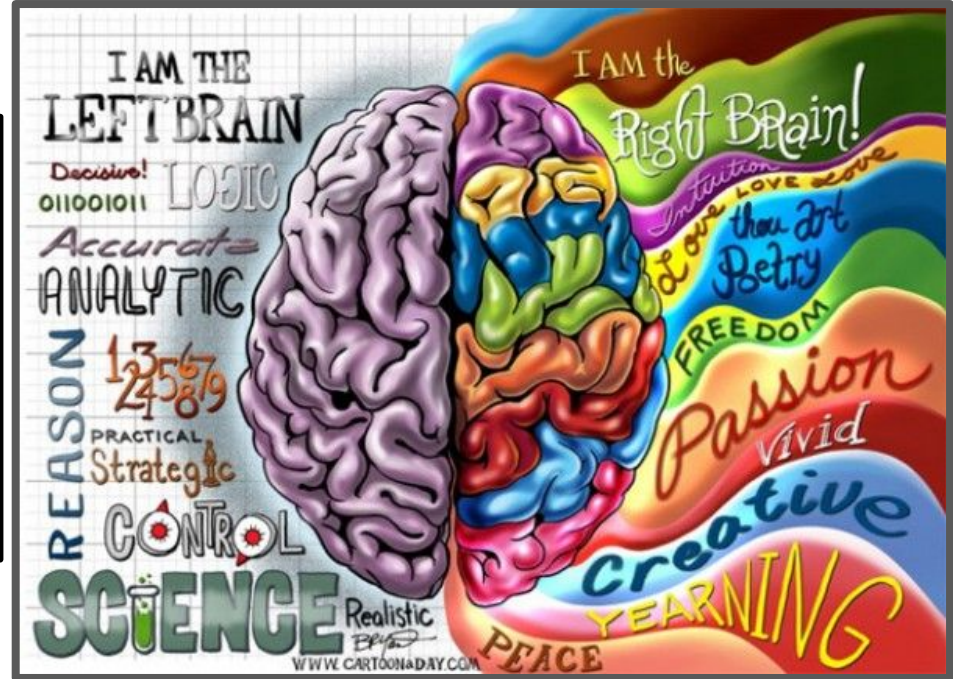


Altitude refers to how high something is above sea level on Earth. Planes, for instance, fly at an altitude of several kilometers (miles). And if you're at the top of a mountain, you will be at a higher altitude than when you're next to the ocean. Altitude can also be used to describe heights on other planets.
