An atmosphere is an envelope of gas around a planet, dwarf planet or moon.

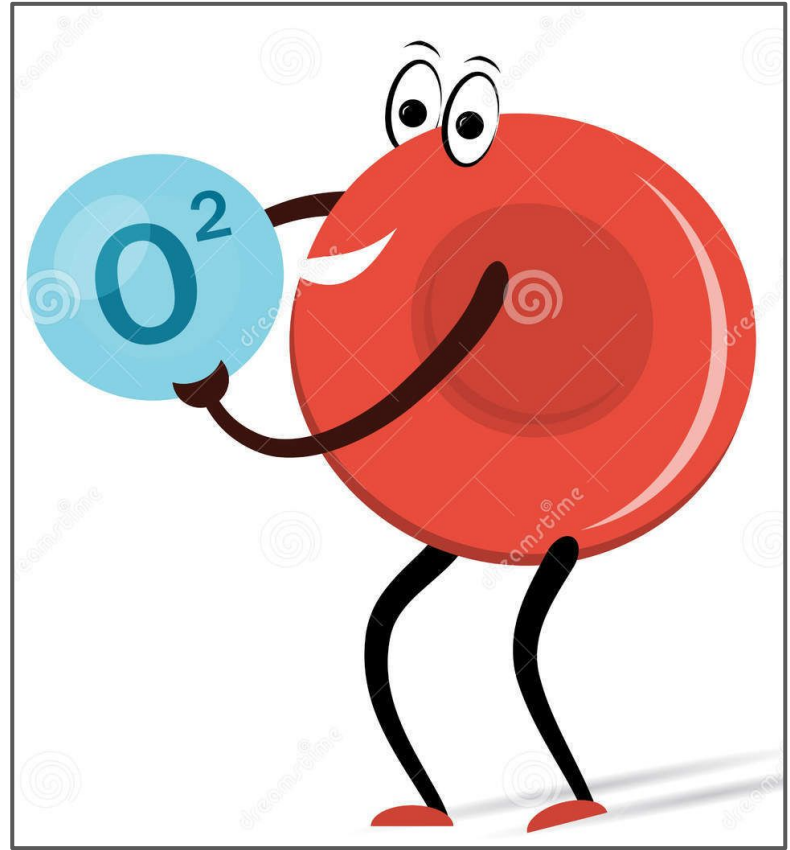


An atmosphere is a jacket of gas surrounding a planetary body. This picture of Earth's atmosphere at sunset was taken from the International Space Station. The lowest layer of the atmosphere, the troposphere, appears reddish brown. Other layers of the atmosphere above it appear in light and dark shades of blue.
