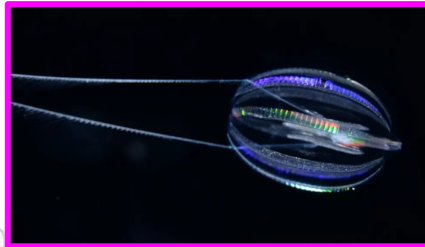

## **COGNITION**

Cognition is involved in all conscious mental activity, from thinking and reasoning to remembering.



Cognition is how the brain gains, stores and uses knowledge. Learning and solving problems are examples of cognition. So are perceiving the world and remembering experiences. Using language and imagination are also aspects of cognition. These brain functions form the basis of our thoughts and actions in daily life.
