
From saving water to ditching the car, there are many small changes we can make to help save our beautiful planet.

by Britta Teckentrup A rhyming non-fiction picture book about the life of bees, and how honey is made.


This is perfect for exploring nature, and also shows how bees communicate.

## Nursery




This week Nursery have been celebrating STEM week, we had a special visit from the planetarium, we had our maths lessons outside and dressed up on Friday.


