BOOK TALK - It is Anti-Bullying Week so our book choices today reflect themes of kindness, empathy and understanding.





other kid, but he's not always seen that way.


This book taps into every child's longing to belong, and to be seen for who they truly are. It's the perfect way to talk about empathy, difference and kindness with young children.

Finally, we were delighted to welcome lparents to our **Maths Workshop** this week where the children enjoyed share our CPA approach to understanding maths.


