We would like you to take a picture of you and your family praying around the virtual crib and print or email it into your child's class teacher by <u>Monday 11th December.</u>


BOOK TALK - Our focus this week are books which have been published recently, which we have added to our library wishlist.

Key Stage 1 **Little Wolf** By Peter Donnelly






