



















This week, we have been writing plans in preparation for writing our stories next week. We have loved creating our own setting and characters.


This week our wonderful NED champions are: Fabian in 2LM and Ashwin in 2CM. Well done to you both! ©

This week in English, we looked at what biographies were. We planned and wrote a biography on Howard Carter, the person who discovered Tutankhamun's tomb.

We also learned about the different ancient Egyptian gods and the role of the Egyptians' belief system in their society.


In Maths, we continued our work on length. We compared different units of measurement (which is longer, 70mm or 6cm?) and solved addition and subtraction word problems based on it.

Our RE lesson was about prayer. Children learned that prayer is central to a Christian's life journey and that it is a way of keeping in daily contact with God.

Year 4 have thoroughly enjoyed investigating 'States of Matter' in our continuing topic for Science.

The children have been demonstrating their learning through the use of diagrams and charts, describing their scientific investigation in different 'stations' including, reversing changes from ice to water, water to water vapour and the impact of salt on ice and how this changes.

We have started a new topic on 'Fractions' and are learning about mixed fractions, improper fractions and proper fractions.

In French, the children have been learning about weather and will be using this vocabulary to do a weather forecast using their knowledge of countries on a map.

In 4D, Elvis is our NED champion this week, for always participating so enthusiastically in lessons. He consistently has his hand up in class and makes a superb effort to engage in every aspect of his learning. What a star! Well done Elvis

This week, Year 5 worked incredibly hard on their independent writing of a narrative poem! The poems were inspired by our reading of The Malfeasance by Alan Bold. The children used a terrifying monster as a metaphor for our worries and negative emotions and were really creative in their explorations of how we can overcome those emotions. Year 5 also had a great time in the library acting out role plays on the Passover. Well done, everyone!


