Message from Mr Dachtler






Dear Parents



WORLD BOOK DAY






WORLD BOOK DAY CLASSROOM DOOR COMPETITION





As the children found out this week our very own Mr Gallagher will have his first book published in June this year. Watch the trailer to find out more. You can also preorder the book by clicking on this link.








Headlines of the week



Wonderful Word Club has been happening in school since Autumn one term.


Please encourage your children to join us and build a deeper knowledge of scripture or you may indeed like to do this together at home.


